

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE AWARD OF MEDALS

1. This regulation shall be cited as Regulation No.284..... of the University of Peradeniya.
2. It is hereby determined as required by Part V Section 29 (m) of the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978 that the mode and conditions of competition for the award of the **Sri Lanka Pharmacy Gold Medal for Academic Excellence in Pharmacy** endowed by **Mr. Sellamuthu Velauthem, Chairman/Managing Director, Sri Lanka Pharmacy (PVT) Ltd., No 39, D.S. Senanayake Veediya, Kandy** shall be governed by the following provisions:
 - 2.1. The award shall be called the **Sri Lanka Pharmacy Gold Medal for Academic Excellence in Pharmacy**
 - 2.2. The award shall be given annually to the students who have recorded the **Highest Cumulative GPA of not less than 3.50** in **Bachelor of Pharmacy Honours Degree** awarded by the Faculty of Allied Health Sciences (General Condition 7.2) based on the criteria as determined by the Faculty of Allied Health Sciences and
 - 2.2.1. Passed all the subjects in the relevant examinations conducted by the Faculty and has obtained a minimum of a Second Class (Upper Division) pass or its equivalent Final GPA.
3. In the event of a tie, the **Faculty of Allied Health Sciences** shall select the most suitable candidate based on the total number of A+ and A grades at all Levels.
4. The final selection of the recipient of the award shall be confirmed by the Senate based on the recommendation of the Faculty Board of Faculty of Allied Health Sciences.

The gold medal is to be awarded at the General Convocation and a cash award of the remainder of 80% of the interest from the investment for this medal; up to the maximum amount allowed, will be given to the recipient.
5. If the award is not given in any particular year, the entire annual income shall be credited to the Capital.

6. General Conditions

- 6.1 **Mr. Sellamuthu Velauthem, Chairman/Managing Director, Sri Lanka Pharmacy (PVT) Ltd., No 39, D.S. Senanayake Veediya, Kandy)** who wish to award a Medal shall donate to the University a minimum sum of Rupees One million (Rs. 1,000,000.00) for a Medal or the equivalent in foreign currency.
- 6.2 Eighty percent of the annual income from the above investment, or a sum decided by the University from time to time, shall be utilized for the annual award and the balance added to the capital at the end of each year.
- 6.3 In all matters arising in relation to the above award the decision of the Senate shall be final.
- 6.4 Where a sum of money donated to the University is found to be inadequate, the University may alter the terms of the award in consultation with the donor or his/her successor where possible.
- 6.5 The University shall have the sole discretion to determine the type of investment of the capital from time to time in order to obtain the best possible return on such investments.
- 6.6 No award shall be given to any student against whom disciplinary or legal action is pending or to any student who has been subject to punishment by the University or a Court of Law while being registered as a student of the University.

It is hereby determined as required by Part V Section 29 (m) of the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978 that the mode and conditions of competition for the award of the **Celogen Lanka Gold Medal for Excellence in Pharmaceutical Sciences** endowed by **Mr. V. 2.1. The award shall be called the **Celogen Lanka Gold Medal for Excellence in Pharmaceutical Sciences**

2.2 The award shall be given annually to the students who have recorded the **Highest cumulative GPA of not less than 3.50 in Pharmaceutical Sciences modules specified in 2.2.2.a of old curriculum and 2.2.2.b. of new curriculum in the Bachelor of Pharmacy Honours Degree** awarded by the Faculty of Allied Health Sciences (General Condition 7.2) based on the criteria as determined by the Faculty of Allied Health Sciences and

3. In the event of a tie, the **Faculty of Allied Health Sciences** shall select the most suitable candidate based on the total number of A+ and A grades for the modules stated in 2.2.2. In the case of a further tie, the total marks obtained by the students for courses stated in 2.2.2 that were used to calculate his/her overall (considering all the courses stated in 2.2.2 taken by the student) cumulative GPA will be considered and, the student with the highest overall marks will be named as the recipient for the scholarship.

4. The final selection of the recipient of the award shall be confirmed by the Senate based on the recommendation of the Faculty Board of Faculty of Allied Health Sciences.

The gold medal is to be awarded at the General Convocation and a cash award of the remainder of 80% of the interest from the investment for this medal; up to the maximum amount allowed, will be given to the recipient.
